A Study On Tokyo Urban Landscape Plan -with a Focus on Form and Shape of the City of Tokyo-

[SYNOPSIS]

The current Tokyo, has become a major part of the global city full of huge spread Kanto Plain. 23 wards of Tokyo is the center area, there is concentration of political, economic and cultural center functions.
