[SYNOPSIS]

Copenhagen, the capital of Denmark, is known as a beautiful waterside city. It is said that "the happiest country in the world, people live richly and the level of quality of life is high. Copenhagen is the comfortable city to live in because of the enhancement of social system and welfare policy. Also it is pointed out as an example of the successful city planning, because the base of the city structure is established hardy.

The structure of Copenhagen city is based on the medieval town planning and artificial canal planning. At that time, the town planner and engineer from Amsterdam in Holland were invited and they made a plan with artificial canal because the land of Denmark is flat as well as Holland. Also it is agricultural country because of the lack of natural resource. We don't' think the city planning and conservation of environment separately.
